Who's responsible for a great ride this weekend? You are.

Be Responsible

- Have your valid insurance, registration, license plate
- Know where camping and riding are allowed
- Be aware of trail regulations and advisories

Be Safe

- All riders must wear an approved helmet (if's the law)
- OHV operators under the age of 14 must be supervised by a parent
- One headlamp, one rear lamp approved muffler with spark arrester

Be Respectful

- Ride on approved trails only
- Wheels out of the water, away from shorelines, keep away from wet land
- Pack it in take it out –remove all garbage

Be Courteous

- Use courtesy when you meet others on the trail
- Pull over, remove helmets and give right of way to horseback riders
- Shut off the engine when you are near horses
