

About the Motorcyclists Confederation of Canada

The Motorcyclists Confederation of Canada (MCC) is a national, federally incorporated not-for-profit association. It was formed to ensure the future of motorcycling in Canada by protecting and advancing motorcyclists' interests and rights, through representations to the federal government of Canada and its agencies, to other national institutions and to international organizations and agencies. The MCC supports and encourages the development of Provincial and Territorial riders' organizations and provides a coordinating role on national concerns.

MCC is a rider's organization, conceived of in the early 2000's, founded in the summer of 2004, and incorporated in January 2005.

MCC is an umbrella organization, capturing all aspects and dimensions of motorcycle transportation and recreation. Whether it's scooters or cruisers or sportbikes; whether it's competition, recreation or transportation; whether it's off-road or dual-sport or street riding, whether it's vintage, mainstream, or custom, there's a place for it in MCC.

More than 200 organizations belong to the MCC and collectively include more than 70,000 riders on their rosters.

MCC is steered, directed and supported by riders. The Board is elected by members and representative of all provinces and territories as well as industry representation.

MCC collaborates with rider groups in other countries (FEMA – Federation of European Motorcycle Associations / MRF – Motorcycle Riders Foundation (USA)) to share ideas and resources.

Principal MCC activities beyond advocacy include:

- Co-producing "Motorcycling RPM" (Risk and Performance Management) consisting of symposia, materials and events *designed to bring all stakeholders together regularly to move towards an Agenda for motorcycle safety in Canada.*
- Operating the Canadian Motorcycle Hall of Fame through an independent charitable foundation with its own Board of Directors.
- Collaborating with industry and other off-road groups through our Off-Road Council to fight anti-motorcycle legislation and land access issues.
- Our Women Riders Council surveys women's attitudes and needs with respect to motorcycling, and encourages motorcycling activity.
